Paweł Świeboda is the president of demosEUROPA – Centre for European Strategy. He served as the EU Advisor to the President of Poland in the years 1996-2000. After that he headed the Office for European Integration in the Chancellery of the President. In the years 2001-2006 he served as Director of the Department of the European Union in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He writes weekly column on Polish-EU relations in "Gazeta Wyborcza", Poland's largest daily. Paweł was also rapporteur of the Review of European Innovation Partnerships in the years 2013-2014 and is a Member of the Reflection Group on the New Pact for Europe.

Cecilia Westström is Senior Advisor at Statistics Sweden and leads project or does analyzing work for the Director General. She has worked a long time for Statistics Sweden and was the Director of Communication up to 2013. Cecilia was the project leader of Hack for Sweden, which started as an idea among several state agencies to stimulate the use of their data and statistics. The result was a weekend event for IT developers who came up with ideas and prototypes of web services and products.
